Unit Credit Points

All units are worth 6 credit points.

Students will complete 144 credit points over a period of 3 years (full-time), i.e. 24 units.

Enrolment

Enrolment of maximum 4 units (24 credit points) in each semester for 6 semesters (3 years).

Pre-requisites

A unit that you must have successfully completed, i.e. achieved at least a **PASS** grade, before you can enrol in the higher level unit.

Co-requisite

Co-requisite in relation to a given unit is a designated unit which is studied before or at the same time as the given subject and must be passed before the given subject can be counted towards a degree.
