#### BACHELOR OF BUSINESS AND COMMERCE RULES

- To complete the degree, students need to complete 24 units (144 points). Students must not exceed 24 units.
- Students may complete a maximum of ten (10) first-year level units (60 points).
- Students must complete a minimum of six (6) third- year level units (36 points) of which at least four (24 points) are Bachelor of Business and Commerce listed units.
- A major requires eight units with no more than two units (12 points) at level 1 credited to the major and at least three units (18 points) at level 3 credited to the major.
- No more than eight electives can be chosen from another faculty.
- In addition to specific unit prerequisites, third-year level units require the successful completion of two second-year level units and second-year level units require the successful completion of three first-year level units.
- Course must be completed within 8 years of commencing course.
