Project Title: Orang Asli (Indigenous people in Malaysia) healthcare and well-being

1. Brief Background of Research Project

This project is an expansion of our previous indigenous psychology study on OA sufferings amont Temiar group. It was found that healthcare utilization is low among OA resettlement due to inaccessibility issue, and cultural mismatch of healthcare model which create mistrust towards the system. Hence a thorough and deeper understanding of OA perception towards healthcare system from a biopsychosocial system perspective is needed.

2. Project Description

This project is an ongoing collaboration with SEACO in Segamat and NGO in Ulu Perak to investigate the OA's unique worldview and cultural transformation of lifestyles and cognition in modern days. It is also an inter-disciplinary project with other OA scholars from anthropology, public health and business. The study will be a mixed-method community approach in nature (qualitative and quantitative).

The candidate we are looking for should be passionate about performing a range of research activities and provides support for the day-to-day running for the research project and field data collection.

A fully-funded PhD position is available in the School of Medicine & Health Sciences at Monash University Malaysia. Subject to satisfactory progress, the candidate can apply for a School of Medicine & Health Sciences merit scholarship (for a period not exceeding) 42 months of candidature.

Candidates must meet the minimum admission requirements (academic and English language proficiency) for the research degree. Scholarship will be selected based on comprehensive ranking of academic achievement, research publications, and research experience or research-related awards.
